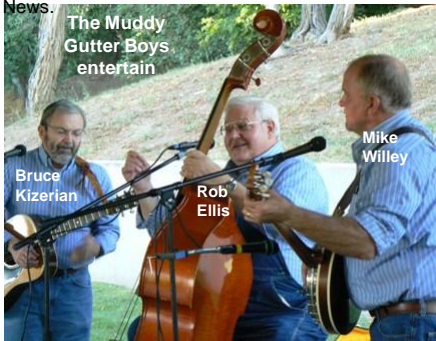

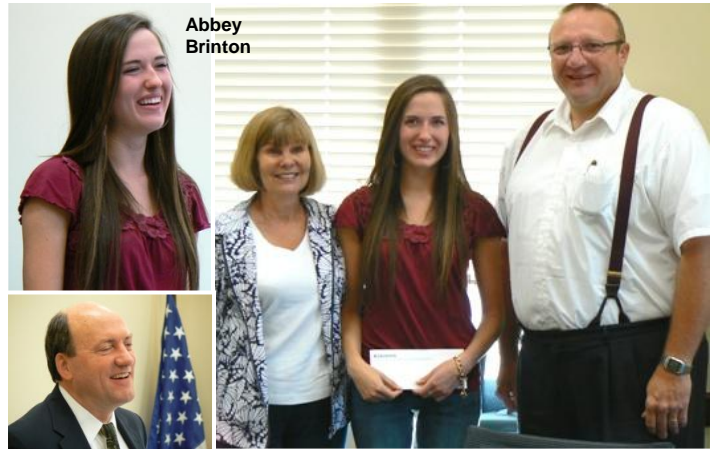

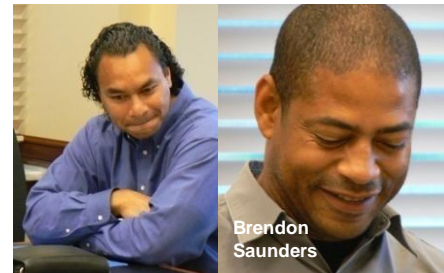
Will Unga

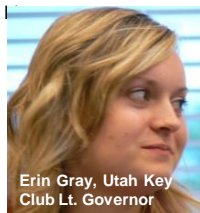

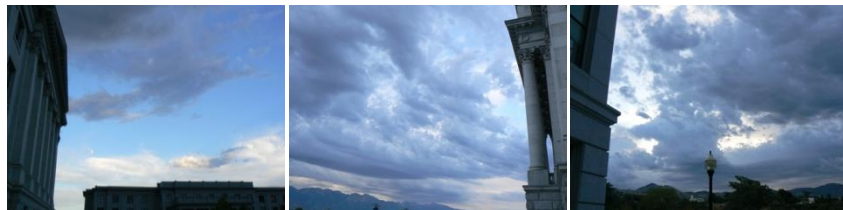
CH Kiwanians in 2 concessions booths at WHS football game on Aug 28 help get \$1000+
