Lynda Krause, currently an assistant US attorney, wanted to compete in the Olympics when she was young. But at age 14, she broke her back while training. Now, when not fighting against crimes against children, she helps coach upcoming gymnasts at the U of U, one of the best programs in the country. Lynda says gymnastics helps kids thrive and build their self esteem.

Dr. Keith Finlayson has submitted his photos to KSL for 25 years. Some of them have even been used for backdrops for newscasters. He shared with Kiwanisans a terrific array of sunsets and city shots and moon shots. (See below.)

Leslie Matthews knows how to treat someone for any kind of burn. She said the University of Utah Burn Center treats 600 patients each year from infancy to geriatrics. It's very difficult day-to-day work, but rewarding when they can alleviate pain and help "survivors" rebuild confidence in their lives. It takes special training. Unfortunately, many victims are young children, burned by hot water, campfires, or from abuse.

Jim Soper found it took a lot of effort to adopt children from the Ukraine. He's an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Utah with a very soft heart for children. He described the incredible challenges, red tape, and multiple trips to the Ukraine to adopt Onya, age 14, and André, age 9. He saw first hand that orphans in the Ukraine are destitute. We are so blessed.
